Cooking Up a Healthier North IA

Thanks to a grant from The Wellmark Foundation and HEALTH for Life, we are piloting local food cooking classes and demonstrations with local partners and farmers markets this coming season. We're excited to announce that classes and demos will use a 'Charlie Cart' – a mobile cooking class unit that uniquely provides equipment and workspace for presenters.



We are partnering with Cerro Gordo County Dept. of Public Health, Franklin General Hospital, the Mason City Family YMCA, and the farmers markets in Clear Lake and Mason City to impact a wide-sample of participants.

As a part of this project, we will again be offering **Kids Cooking Classes at the Farmers Markets**, including:

- 4:30-6:30pm on 2nd Tues. of June, July and Aug. at the North Iowa Farmers Market in Mason City
- 9:30-11:30am on the 4th Sat. of June & July at the Clear Lake Farmers Market.

Also look for monthly cooking demonstrations to be hosted at farmers markets in Mason City and Clear Lake.



We believe in celebrating the great work being done in North Iowa by highlighting a local business who we feel is moving that needle. This month we'd like to shine the light on **Jóia Food Farm in Charles City**. Wendy Johnson and Johnny Rafkin's mission is for their plants and animals to work together to create healthy soils, healthy animals, a healthy environment and most importantly healthy food.

They raise 100% grass-fed lamb, diverse-diet fed pigs, chicken for meat and eggs, and seasonal turkeys all in their pastures, their fields and



their farm yard. Jóia Food Farm's crops and pastures are certified USDA organic and their animals are Animal Welfare Approved, 100% Grass-fed, and Non-GMO certified. In addition to farming, Wendy is powerful advocate for women in agriculture and for transitioning to organic on lowa farms.
